ARTICLE I
Bathing Suits

[Derived from Section 2 of the General Code of Ordinances]

§ 148-1. Wear restricted.

It shall be unlawful to wear bathing suits on the streets except under proper outer covering equivalent in effect to ordinary street dress.

ARTICLE II

Bill Posting

[Derived from Section 3 of the General Code of Ordinances]

§ 148-2. Permit required; restrictions.

- A. It shall be unlawful to post within the village any bills or notices except upon bulletin boards maintained by the village and not upon such bulletin boards unless a permit so to do has been issued. The owner or occupant of premises permitting bills or notices to be posted in violation of this section, as well as the person posting such bill, shall be guilty of such violation.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to post bills or to post, paint or inscribe any sign, placard or other device upon any street, sidewalk or crosswalk without first obtaining a permit.
- C. It shall be unlawful for any person to hang or place any goods or merchandise of any description or any sign or advertising matter of any description on any of the electric light or lamp posts, fire alarm boxes or devices or telephone poles of or in the village.
- D. It shall be unlawful for any person to attach or keep attached to any tree, plant, shrub or pole in or upon any highway or village property or to a stake driven in village property any rope, wire, chain, sign or other device whatsoever without a permit therefor from the Clerk.

ARTICLE III

Conduct at Fires

[Derived from Section 4 of the General Code of Ordinances]

§ 148-3. Obstructing operations of Fire Department.

Any person who, at any time of any fire in the village, shall be guilty of any disorderly conduct or who shall obstruct or attempt to obstruct the operations of the Fire Department, or who shall willfully refuse or neglect to obey, or who shall attempt to prevent or obstruct the execution of the orders of a member of the Board, of the Officials of the Fire Departments or of the Police Department shall be deemed, and is hereby declared to be, a disorderly person.

§ 148-4. False alarms.

It shall be unlawful for any person to give or cause to be given a false alarm of fire within the village.

§ 148-5. Penalties for offenses. [Amended 5-14-1979 by L.L. No. 1-1979]

In addition to the penalties provided for in Chapter 1, General Provisions, Article III, General Penalty, a person convicted of a violation of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to imprisonment not to exceed 30 days.

ARTICLE IV

Disorderly Conduct**[Derived from Section 5 of the General Code of Ordinances]****§ 148-6. Disturbing the peace.**

It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in noisy, riotous or tumultuous conduct or language, disturbing or tending to disturb the peace and quiet of the village or any meeting or assembly therein, or to incite or aid in any riotous, tumultuous assemblage, in or on any private property or streets or the doorways or stairways adjacent thereto.

ARTICLE V

Indecent Exposure**[Derived from Section 6 of the General Code of Ordinances]****§ 148-7. Exposure of a person.**

It shall be unlawful for any person willfully or lewdly to expose his person or private parts or procure another so to expose himself in any street or in any place in the village where others are present.

ARTICLE VI

Intoxication**[Derived from Section 7 of the General Code of Ordinances]****§ 148-8. Public intoxication.**

It shall be unlawful for any person while in an intoxicated condition to come upon or otherwise use any street or public place or property of the village.

ARTICLE VII

Profanity**[Derived from Section 8 of the General Code of Ordinances]****§ 148-9. Use of profane or vulgar language in public places.**

It shall be unlawful for any person to use profane, vulgar or obscene language or conversation in any street or on any property of the village.

ARTICLE VIII

Village Signs**[Derived from Section 9 of the General Code of Ordinances]****§ 148-10. Defacement or removal.**

Defacement or removal of any village notice, sign or direction except by duly authorized village official is forbidden.
