MINUTES

The Mayor asked if there were any comments or questions on the February 25, 2013 minutes. There were no comments or questions.

REPORTS

Police Commissioner Schwarzfeld discussed the monthly Police report with Chief Mosiello.

The Chief noted that there were two good arrests. One was a domestic dispute at Fairway Market and the other involved Chase bank and a woman who supplied blank cards to be magnetized and used at the bank's ATM. The charges in the second case included ninety four counts of unlawful possession of identification.

There was a decrease in the number of aided cases in February. The Chief noted that a special DWI patrol will be funded by Westchester County. It will be located near the Hutchinson River Parkway. Other northern municipalities located along the Hutchinson River Parkway will also participate in this special detail. The Chief also said that the detectives are working on cases involving several robberies.

The Mayor and Board thanked the Chief for his report.

Fire Commissioner Sellier reviewed the monthly Fire report with Chief Ruggiero. He congratulated the Chief on his exploits on ice. The Mayor commented that the Chief had recently been honored at a Rangers game at Madison Square Garden for his involvement with youth hockey programs and with special needs hockey players. He said that it was a well deserved honor.

The Chief commented on a fire that went well after the floor was opened. He said that it was a relatively busy routine month.

Commissioner Sellier commented on the extraordinarily good attendance of the department.

The Mayor and Board thanked the Chief for his report. Chief Ruggiero said that it was a pleasure to serve under Mayor O'Connor.

There was a question on the fines for false alarms. The Manager said that if someone has more than three false alarms in a ninety day period, they will receive a bill from the Village.

RESOLUTION TO AWARD BIDS FOR STREET SWEEPING AND WEIHMANN PARK MAINTENANCE

Mayor O'Connor said that Manager Pierpont recommended the low bidders for street sweeping and maintenance for Weihman Park . Quotes for these jobs are requested annually.

The Village received two quotes for street sweeping. East Coast Industrial Services Inc. quoted two thousand seven hundred sixty three dollars and sixty four cents. Three D Industrial Maintenance Corporation quoted two thousand five hundred eighty five dollars for the job. Three D Industrial was the low bidder for street sweeping.

The Village received four quotes for Weihman Park Maintenance. Two of the quotes were received late and could not be considered. A Palmieri Landscaping Company quoted a price of three thousand three hundred seventy five dollars and Moretti Landscaping quoted a price of three thousand five hundred dollars. A. Palmieri Landscaping Company was the low bidder for Weihman Park maintenance.

After discussion and upon motion duly made and seconded, it was unanimously

RESOLVED, That Three D Industrial Industrial Maintenance Corporation, the low bidder for street sweeping, be and hereby is awarded the work for a sum of two thousand nine hundred Five hundred eighty five dollars, and that A. Palmieri Landscaping Company, the low bidder for Weihman Park Maintenance, be and hereby is awarded the work for a sum of three thousand three hundred seventy five dollars.
